

## **NSPIRE Inspector Training – Phase 2 Syllabus**

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### **1. Course Description**

Phase 2 of the NSPIRE Inspector Training Program focuses on applied inspection practice and use of the NSPIRE inspection software platform.

This phase builds upon Phase 1 standards knowledge and prepares participants to conduct inspections using required software tools and documentation workflows.

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### **2. Prerequisite**

Successful completion of Phase 1 training and required assessments is mandatory prior to participation in Phase 2.

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### **3. Phase 2 Learning Objectives**

Upon successful completion of Phase 2, participants will be able to:

- Navigate NSPIRE inspection software workflows
- Perform inspection data entry accurately
- Apply scoring concepts within the software platform
- Conduct a mock inspection using required tools
- Identify and avoid common data-entry errors
- Understand submission and documentation procedures

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### **4. Technical Requirements (Phase 2 Specific)**

In addition to Phase 1 technical requirements, trainees must have:

- A desktop or laptop computer
- An Apple iPad (preferred) or iPhone
- The ExAM4Inspections application downloaded prior to training

Android devices are not supported for Phase 2 exercises.

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### **5. Phase 2 Schedule Overview**

#### **Day 4 – NSPIRE Software Training & Applied Practice (8 Hours)**

- Hands-on NSPIRE software instruction
- Mock or simulated inspection workflows
- Data entry, review, and submission procedures

#### **Assessments:**

- NSPIRE Software Examination
- Practical mock inspection exercise

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## **6. Assessment & Evaluation**

Participants are evaluated based on:

- Participation in applied instruction
- Completion of required software exercises
- Successful completion of the NSPIRE Software Exam

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## **7. Completion Criteria – Phase 2**

Participants complete Phase 2 upon:

- Meeting attendance and monitoring requirements
- Successfully completing applied exercises
- Passing required software assessments

Upon successful completion of both Phase 1 and Phase 2, trainees are eligible for issuance of a Certificate of Completion.
